Parent Café for Online Safety

On Wednesday 27th February at 9am we are hosting a parent café on online safety led by the Southwark Safeguarding Lead Trainer - Charlotte Kathe. The workshop will focus on e-safety and how to keep children safe online. The main focus will be on e-safety especially gaming, video platforms like YouTube and social media and the opportunities and risks associated with that. Government Funding for Schools

We are aware that the number of parents contributing toward school trips and events has declined recently. We completely understand the financial pressures already faced by many families. With this in mind, we ask you to please consider checking your eligibility for funding, which will allow us to support you financially when paying for trips and events.

Examples of additional funding provision

Our school uses the funding to improve the quality of education and experiences. This could include support and training from specialists such as the Educational Psychologist or Speech and Language Therapist, adapted provision or interventions, class trips, music tuition, after school clubs, visitors to school, family support from our Early Help Manager (list not exhaustive).

To find out whether you have a *statutory* entitlement to Free School Meals for your child, and hence whether SJSC would receive additional funding, please fill in the details requested on the link below. However, before you apply, please read the **Criteria for Eligibility*** below

*Criteria for Eligibility

Your child is eligible for free school meals funding if you're in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190

The additional money is available from central government for every child, whose parent is receiving one of the benefits listed above.
