This week in **Reception**, we began the week with mystery jars of seeds... they were all sorts of interesting shapes and sizes so we tried to work out what might grow from them. We shared the story The Tiny Seed by Eric Carle, and acted out some of the scenes. Then (and this was the best bit!) we made our own books working in teams drawing and writing about our favourite parts in the story. We have been planting the first of our seeds, to find out what will help them grow. We are still collecting tin cans and plant posts so that we can all grow our own bean plants next week.



In English, **Year 1** have been preparing to write our own section of our books, 'Send for a superhero!'. We worked in pairs to sequence the key parts of our story and then we matched up time adverbials (e.g. first, lastly, next) to each section of our story sequence. Our Science lesson saw us beginning to identify and name some common flowers such as rose, buttercup and bluebells. We will be brilliant sources of knowledge when it comes to planting the pollinator's bed in the playground soon!



In **Year 2** we have been linking our learning in English, Art, Science and Maths to design our own amazing dragon machines, based upon our current book "The Dragon Machine". Children designed their own machines, then added expanded noun phrases to describe our inventions. To link our Science topic of Materials, we discussed the appropriate materials to use such as rubber claw wheels, waterproof flexible plastic wings and a metal sturdy, mechanical engine. Finally, as we've been exploring 2D and 3D shapes in maths, we discussed some of these and highlighted them on our inventions.

In Science, in **Year 3** this week, we did an experiment to see if we could prove that the stems of plants transport water. However, first, we had a good look at some sticks of celery to understand the structure of a stem. We snapped it and pulled it apart. We discovered the outer edges were tough and stringy to support and protect the plant and the inner parts soft and juicy. We then all had a nibble as part of our Jigsaw discussion about healthy eating and staying healthy. Did you know that celery has less than a gram of natural sugar?



In **Year 4** in PSHE, we have been focusing on the topic, 'Healthy Me'. Together, we have been learning how to build healthy relationships by looking at scenarios and offering advice to help resolve situations. This week, we discussed possible solutions if pressured by friends and spent time listening to each other's advice, learning and reflecting as a team.





In **Year 5**, our maths task was to measure accurately and compare measurements. Is anyone taller than Miss Stewart?



This week in **Year 6** we had a visit from The Nest. We spoke about or transition to secondary school, how change can make us feel, and found tools we can use when we feel stressed in order to help ourselves overcome uncomfortable feelings.
